SUBJECT: Glenview Mansion Subcommittee Recommendation

At our meeting held on October 27, 2011 the Recreation and Park Advisory Board discussed its position regarding the future operation of the Glenview Mansion Subcommittee.

The Board voted unanimously to adopt the attached staff recommendation, which includes the following key points:

- A. The Glenview Mansion Subcommittee should remain in operation per the Mayor and Council resolution adopted in 1991. It should remain a Subcommittee of the Recreation and Park Advisory Board
- B. The Subcommittee should be composed of representatives from the Recreation and Park Advisory Board (2), Cultural Arts Commission (1), and Historic District Commission (1).
- C. The Subcommittee should be re-named "The Civic Center Subcommittee." This name better reflects the overall purpose of the committee, which is to provide guidance in preserving the historic integrity, aesthetic appeal, economic viability and the varied usage of the Civic Center as an important Citywide and neighborhood park.
- D. The Subcommittee will continue to provide advice and support in implementing the Civic Center vision established in the Long Range Plan for Glenview Mansion and its Grounds, as adopted in 2002 by the Mayor and Council.
