

WHEREAS, Moving Day highlights "movement" and exercise as symbols of hope and progress due to their essential role in treating Parkinson's Disease; and


WHEREAS, Moving Day brings together those with Parkinson's Disease, their caregivers, families, friends, healthcare professionals, corporate leaders and teams; and


