

Resume of John Moser

I have been a resident of Rockville since 1953. Since then I have been a member and Chair of the following City of Rockville Committees and Commissions:

Have been instrumental over the years, (among other achievements), in being closely involved with art for the Rockville Town Center project, as well as with the acquisition of all the Art for the Rockville Art in Public Places (AIPP) program. The Town Center program is still not fully completed. I would like to finish this project while Chair of the Commission.

I am currently involved with Community Ministries of Rockville in a financial advisory capacity; I am a member of the Executive Committee of the Rockville Chamber of Commerce; I am President of the Rockville Scholarship Foundation; and I am founder and, since 1986, have been President/CEO of the F. Scott Fitzgerald Literary Conference, Inc. with major responsibility for the annual F Scott Literary Conference.

Also, I am on the Play Reading Committee of Rockville Little Theatre ; member of the Glenview mansion Sub-committee; am a founder and former Vice Chair of the Unitarian Church of Rockville; as well as currently being Director (since 1996) of the US Air Force Retiree Office with responsibility for managing the AF Retiree Program for the 36,000 AF Retirees in the Greater Washington area.

I retired from the Air Force and the Federal Government in 1983; subsequently spent 12 years in Annapolis as the AA for Senator Gerald Winegrad, and followed that with being the 1st Annapolis lobbyist for the City of Rockville until 2001, when I retired. For 3 years I lectured at the University of Maryland's honors program .

In 2005 I was awarded the Montgomery Counties Community Award for Excellence and am also a recipient of the 2000 Rockville City Lifetime Achievements in the Arts Award.
